Maths	<p>The focus for Year 1 this week is weight and capacity. Have a look around the house for different ways of measuring something. What would you use to measure the height of something, what about the weight or volume?</p> <p>This week Year 2 will be exploring fractions, being able to understand and identify a half and a quarter of an amount. Make this as practical as possible.
