Set A:

E.g.

Yes: Because he finds the shadow funny / because he changes size / because he is very like him

No: Because he has no use / because he jumps into bed first / because he doesn't grow like proper children / because he doesn't know how children should play / because he makes the poet feel like a fool / because he is a coward / because he is lazy and doesn't get up early

Impression: The shadow is mischievous / cheeky / fun.

Meaning as a whole:

9. Pupils should reference the different elements of the poem – e.g. he realised that his shadow changes size, wasn't present when he got up early before the sun got up, stays close to him at other times, made a fool of him, was useless and jumped into bed first.

Authorial intent

E.g. Because the shadow is human-shaped / because it seems to have a life of its own / because it is a companion to the poet / because it moves around, for instance getting into bed.

Compare

11. Pupils may choose a range of answers. E.g. being able to change size and shape; being able to grow quickly (or shrink); being able to stay in bed rather than getting up on early, dark mornings; being able to stay close to someone for comfort/protection; being able to jump into bed first. Accept other justifiable explanations.

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
