Subject	Task	Resources to Support
Phonics	Since we began home learning we have covered all of the phonemes in phase 3. It is important that we know children are really secure in this phase before we move them onto the next. It is common for children to be able to remember the phonemes in isolation but be unable to spot them in words or text or apply them independently. For this reason, we are going to be recapping phase 3 again over the coming weeks, with a greater emphasis on being able to identify and apply their phoneme grapheme correspondence.
