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Writing	<p>This week we are going to be imagining we are like the snail in the story and we have “itchy feet” that are itching to explore the world. Phonics	<p>Since we began home learning we have covered all of the phonemes in phase 3. It is important that we know children are really secure in this phase before we move them onto the next.</p> <p>It is common for children to be able to remember the phonemes in isolation but be unable to spot them in words or text or apply them independently.</p> <p>For this reason, we are going to be recapping phase 3 again over the coming weeks, with a greater emphasis on being able to identify and apply their phoneme grapheme correspondence.</p>	<p>Phonics power point- each day has 4 slides to do.</p> <p>Resources on the BBC Bitesize website to support phonics https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/topics/zvq9bdm</p> <p>Lots of the phonics games we use at school can be accessed for free: https://www.phonicsplay.co.uk/</p>
