Dear Parents

We have become increasingly aware of a video which is currently circulating online that would be highly inappropriate for a child to view. These video clips are mainly appearing on the Social Media platform TikTok, although there are reports of them surfacing on other sites. There are reports that the videos are also 'hidden' within other videos of more appropriate content. TikTok are aware of the concerns and are working to resolve them.

As the video contains inappropriate content we would encourage you to be extra vigilant when your child is using any device or watching any clips.

We would also encourage all parents/carers to remind their children of online safety:

- We encourage you to have conversations with your children about staying safe what would they do if they see something which upsets them? Who would they speak to?
- Be aware of what your children can access online.
- Ensure your children understand the importance of not giving personal information to anyone they do not know.
- Tell your children no-one has the right to make them do anything they do not want to do.
- Use parental controls to keep your children safe.
- Remain calm and non-judgemental.

We have also included a parent advice leaflet on TikTok. Please remember that this platform has an age rating of 12+ meaning that it is not suitable for children under the age of 12.

TikTok is a video-sharing social media app available on iOS and Android which lets users create, share, and view user created videos much in a similar manner to Facebook, Instagram and Snapchat. It's main draw, however, is that users can record and upload bite-sized looping videos of themselves lip-syncing and dancing to popular music or soundbites, often for comedic effect, which can then be further enhanced with filters, emojis and stickers. TikTok has been designed with the young user in mind and has a very addictive appeal. At the beginning of 2019 it skyrocketed in popularity to become the 10S store's most downloaded app with over 33 million downloads. Estimates suggest that it now has anything between 500 million and over 1 billion monthly active users worldwide.

MATURE CONTENT

On the IOS store, TikTok is listed as 12+. On the Google Play Store i rated as 'Parental guidance recommended'. INAPPROPRIATE MUSIC

TikTok revolves around creating music videos through lip-syncin-and dancing. Inevitably, some of the music featured by users will contain explicit or suggestive J %!#&

ONLINE PREDATORS

As a social network, TikTok makes it easy to connect with other users. This includes the ability to comment on and react to other users' videos, follow their profile and download their content. Be eaware that by default, any user can comment on your child's video if their account is set to public. Most interactions are harmless enough but as an app. TikTok is prone to predators because of the abundance of younger users.



ADDICTIVE NATURE

Social media is designed to be addictive and TIKTok is no different. It can be fun and huge entertaining. However, it is also because of it that it can be hard to put down.
