

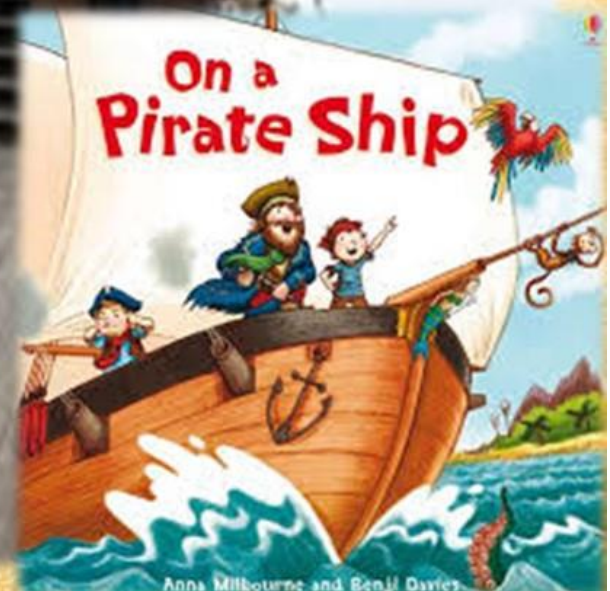

Activity 2

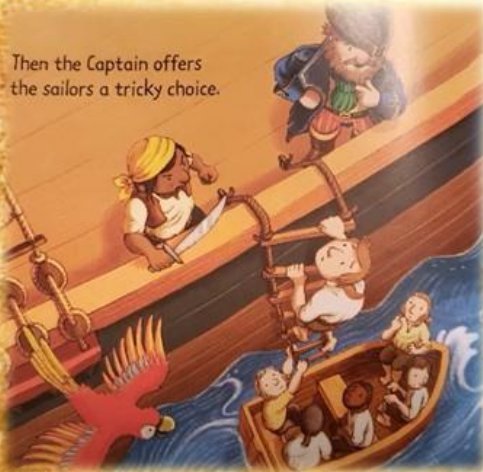
I am learning to form a persuasive argument.
