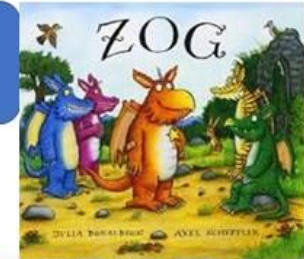




Reading This week we are reading the book "Zog" by Julia Donaldson. Barlow has written some questions, can you answer them?

What did Zog tried his best every day at school to win?




Writing we are going to write about dragons.

What to look for this week on your nature walks

Stag Beetles

Stag beetles spend most of their very long life cycle underground as a larva. This can be anywhere from three to seven years depending on the weather. Periods of very cold weather can extend the process. Once fully grown, the larvae leave the rotting wood they've been feeding on to build a large cocoon in the soil where they pupate and finally metamorphose into an adult. Adults spend the winter underground in the soil and usually emerge from mid-May onwards. By the end of August, most of them will have died. They do not survive the winter. During their short adult lives, male stag beetles spend their days sunning themselves to gather strength for the evening's activities of flying in search of a mate.

Did you know....
The jaws of the male stag beetle look fearsome, but are actually quite weak, making this beetle pretty harmless to humans.
