Stunning Starts

<u>Attendance</u>

A child's attendance should be 96% or above. Any child that falls below 96% is tracked each week. If a child falls below 90%, this is classed as a persistent absentee. This is something that is monitored closely by school, the governors, the Trust and the local authority Education Welfare Officer (EWO). We have protocols in place to support families to improve attendance over time. The first is a letter that outlines the child's attendance has fallen below 96%. We then monitor; if there is no improvement, we invite parents to a meeting to discuss the issues. Parents receive a second letter. If this still does not improve then this is when the EWO would become involved. Over the last few weeks, we have sent out attendance letters and parents have raised concern. We felt we needed to explain the protocols in place.

<u>Snacks</u>

We would like to remind parents providing daily snacks that these should be a healthy choice, for example fruit, vegetables, rice cakes, crackers or popcorn. Please do not send your child with crisps, sweets or chocolate. There is a selection of fruit and vegetables available to the children in the classroom if they do not bring a snack from home.
