Home Learning

At Martlesham, there are expectations for the children to complete some learning at home.

It is expected that the children read at least three times a week and this is recorded in their reading diaries. If the children read three times a week across a term, they will earn a reading badge. The children from Year 1 to Year 6 will be set assignments on Ed Shed appropriate for their current level of learning and it is expected that they spend some time on Ed Shed at home during the week. The children can earn rewards based on the number of points they earn; for each million points the children score in a week, this is converted to a point in school. They earn rewards at 30, 60, 90, 120, 160 and 200 points.

Furthermore, the teachers set **one** piece of creative home learning to be completed across the term which links to your child's theme. Please see the details for this term's home learning below:

Class	Due: 1 November 2023
Holly Blues	A timeline is a line that has important events on it in chronological order. Complete a timeline of your life. Think about the important things that have happened and when, such as being born, starting school and moving year groups
Adonis Blues	Use the internet and information books to find images of artefacts from the Bronze Age. Include an image or drawing of the artefact, the name of the artefact, its use and what it tells us about everyday life in the Bronze Age.
Chalk Hill Blues	Use the internet to search for pictures of the artefacts found at the Sutton Hoo burial site, such as The Franks casket, purse lid and shoulder clasp. Create a piece of Anglo-Saxon art using the designs on the artefacts as inspiration.

This home learning can be handed in on Tapestry, email or as a physical copy in school.



ilver Studded Slues	Draw, paint or sculpt a bust of a significant figure from black history and write a short paragraph to accompany your artwork, explaining why this individual is significant. Figures might include Olaudah Equiano, Claudia Jones, Mary Seacole, William Cuffay, Lenford Kwesi Garrison, William Wilberforce, Thomas Clarkson or Elizabeth Heyrick.
