Home Learning


At Martlesham, there are expectations for the children to complete some learning at home.

It is expected that the children read at least three times a week and this is recorded in their reading diaries. If the children read three times a week across a term, they will earn a reading badge. The children from Year 1 to Year 6 will be set assignments on Ed Shed appropriate for their current level of learning and it is expected that they spend some time on Ed Shed at home during the week. The children can earn rewards based on the number of points they earn; for each million points the children score in a week, this is converted to a point in school. They earn rewards at 30, 60, 90, 120, 160 and 200 points.

Furthermore, the teachers set **one** piece of creative home learning to be completed across the term which links to your child's theme. Please see the details for this term's home learning below:

Holly Blues	<p>Look at these photographs of members of the royal family. Use research to name them and write some facts about each person.</p> 
Adonis Blues	<p>Draw a picture of a Roman soldier with their full clothing and armour then label this. Create this in a way of your choice such as painting, colouring, or collage.</p>

Chalk Hill Blues	Use information books or the internet to find out about pharaohs of ancient Egypt. Choose two pharaohs that you find interesting, draw a picture of them, record the dates of their reign and write a fascinating fact about each one.
Silver Studded Blues	Anderson shelters were used in the Second World War to keep people safe. Create a model of an Anderson shelter in a garden. This is a chance to be creative and you could add extra details such as a vegetable garden. Here is an example and there are many more examples online if you would like some inspiration!
