In Chalk Hill Blues, they have read 'How to Train Your Dragon'.

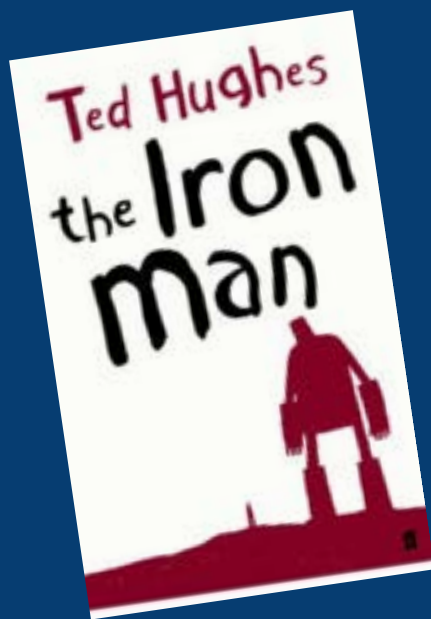
Connie Y4—It is fun, interesting and also there are a lot of words I have not heard of before.

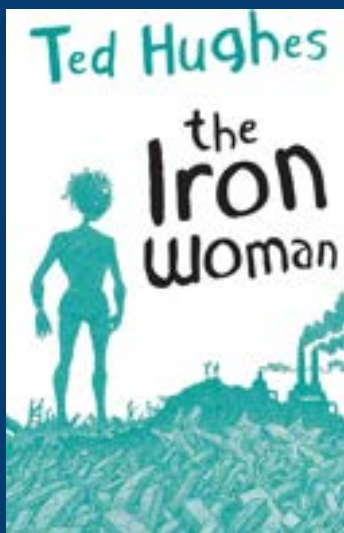


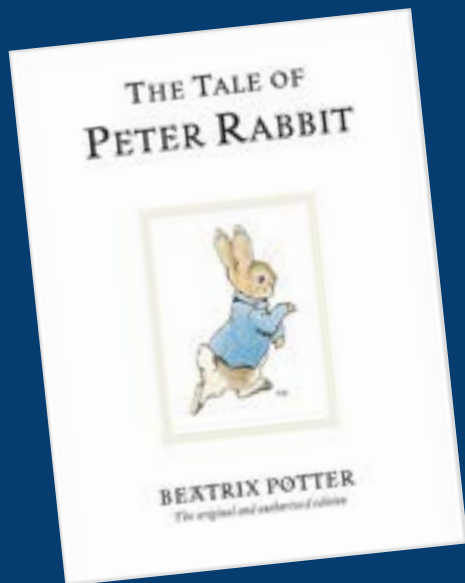
In Adonis Blues, they have read 'Iron Man'.

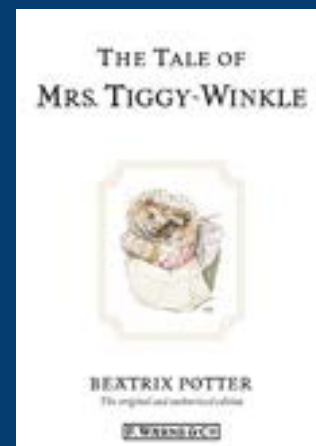


In Holly Blues, they have read 'Peter Rabbit'.

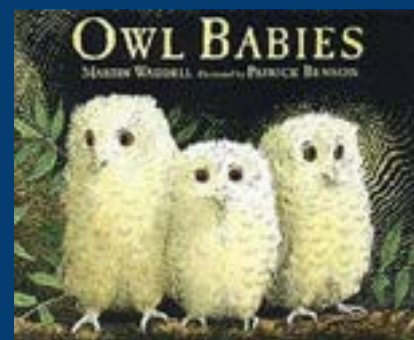
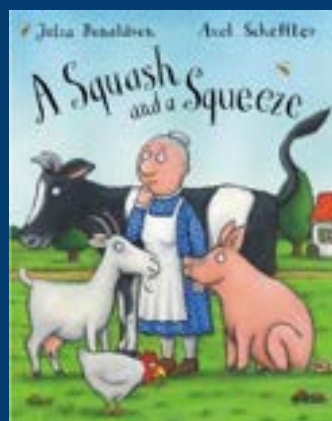


In Small Blues, one of the books they have read is 'The Scarecrow's Wedding'.

Our wonderful Year 5s have opened up the library at lunch time two days a week. We have loved seeing the children enjoying reading together!

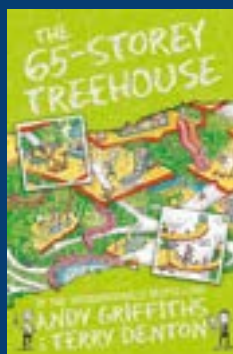


SSB's Recommended Reads!



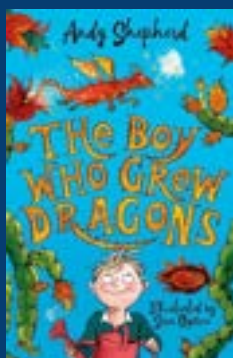
Benhie recommends 'The Nowhere Emporium' by Ross MacKenzie because it is very entertaining!

Ollie B recommends 'Anne Frank's Diary: The Graphic Adaptation' because it teaches about History and it is entertaining because there is a lot of suspense.



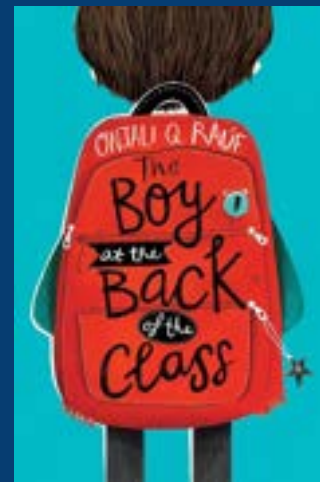
