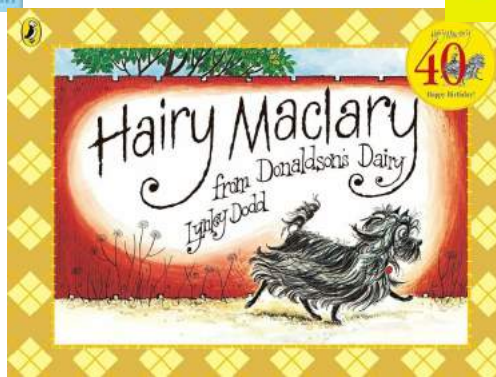
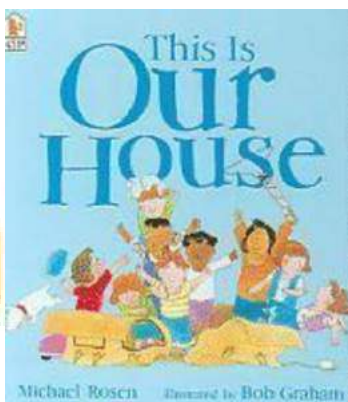


In *Small Blues*, one of the books they have read is 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt'.

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In Holly Blues, they have read 'Stella and the Seagull' by Georgina Stevens.

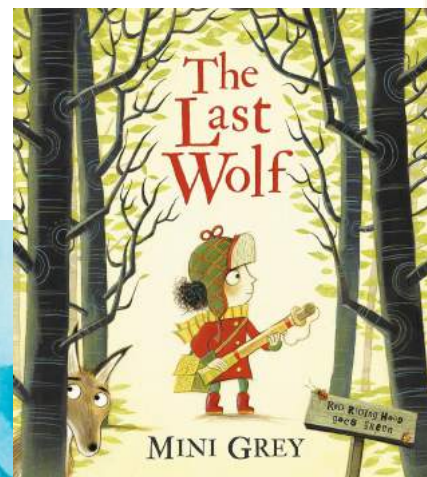


Jacob Y1—I really liked when the seagull came back.

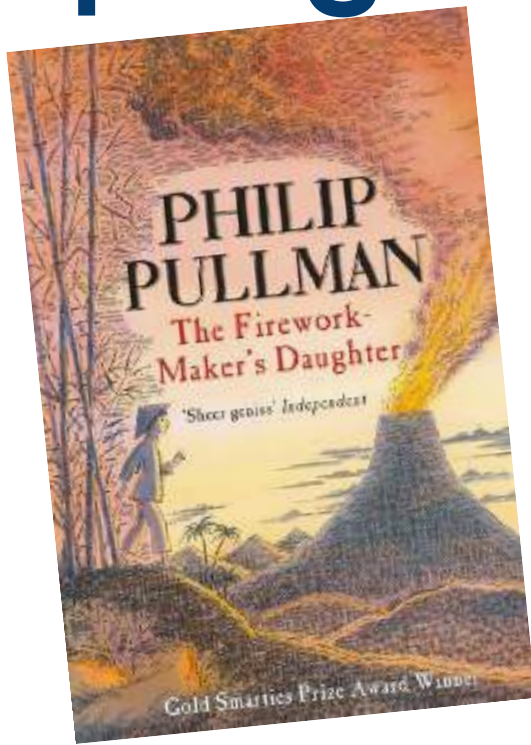
Bodhi Y2—I liked the illustrations.

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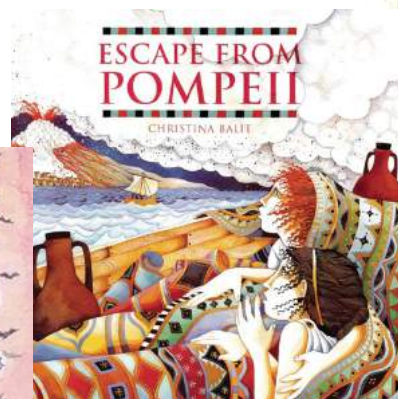
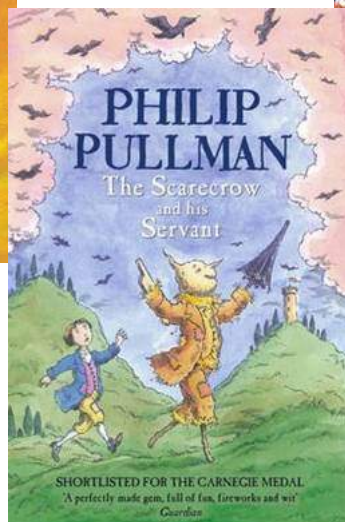
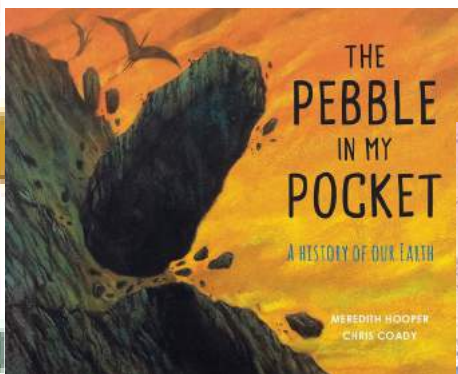


In Adonis Blues, they have read 'The Firework Maker's Daughter' by Philip Pullman.

Florence Y3—I liked the plot of the story when Lila went up the volcano! It was exciting!

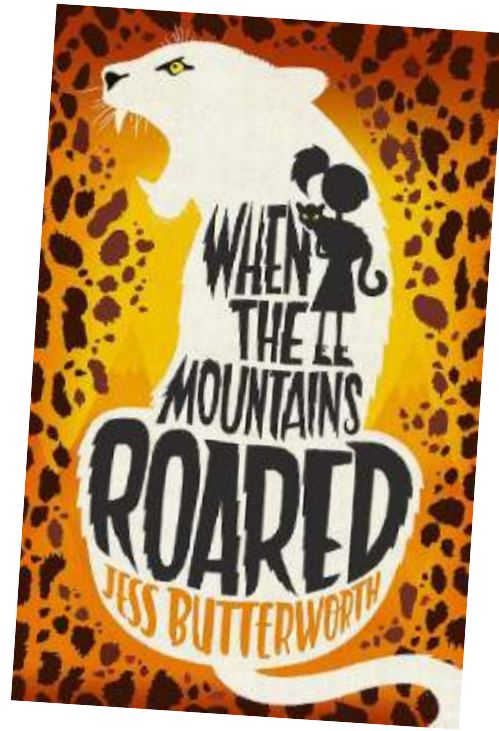
Ralph Y3—I liked all of the characters. My favourite was Hamlet the elephant because I like elephants.

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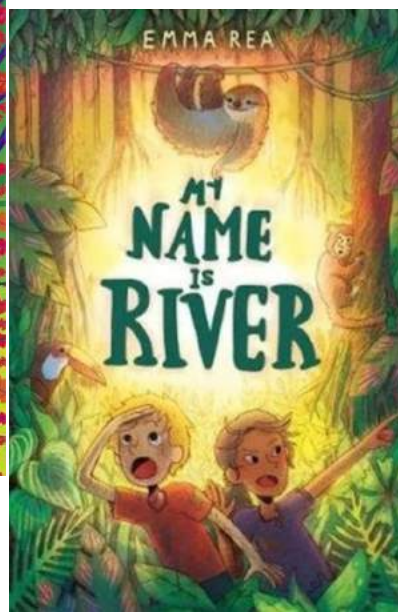
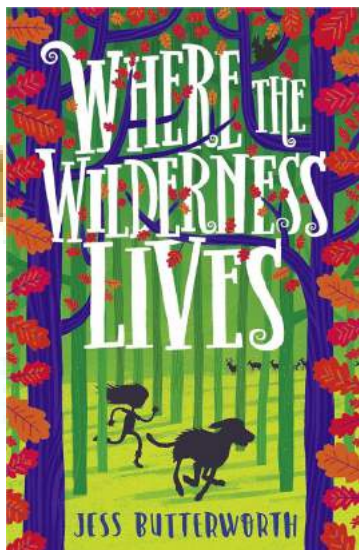
In Chalk Hill Blues, they have read 'When the Mountains Roared' by Jess Butterworth.



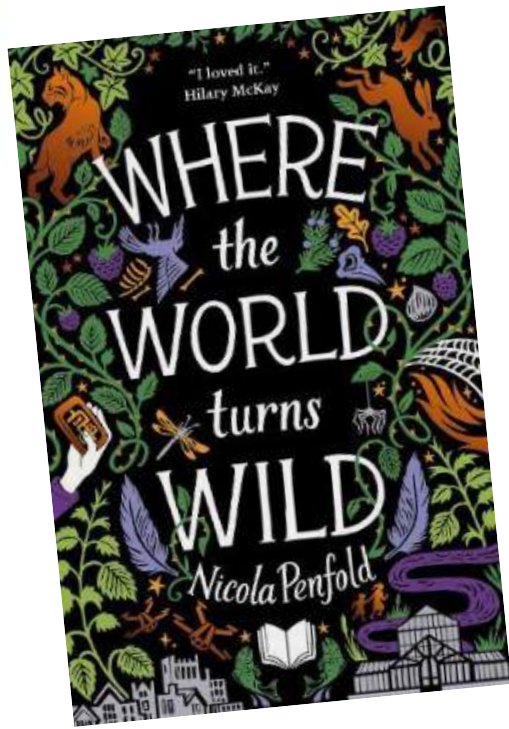
Dylan Y4—I liked all of the characters. My favourite was the Grandma because she was really funny.

Ivy Y4—I enjoyed it because it was fun and playful. I liked when they visited an abandoned hotel on a mountain and they started working on it.

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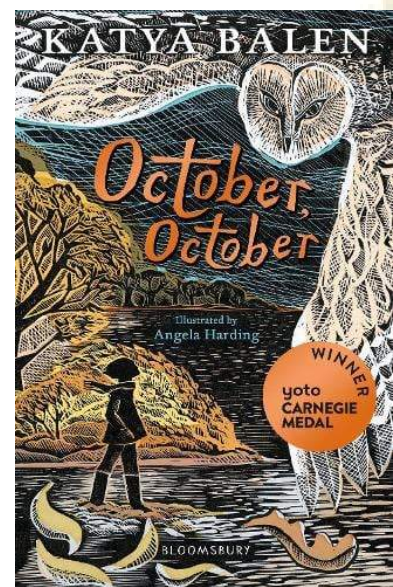
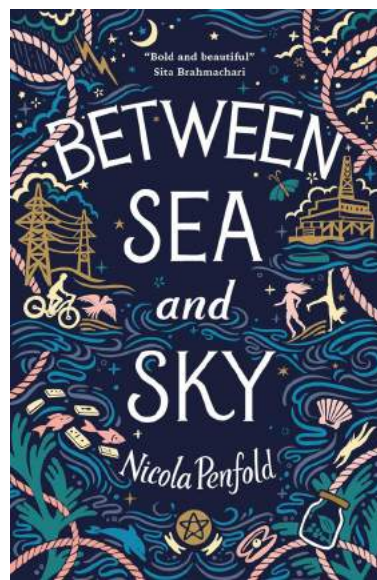
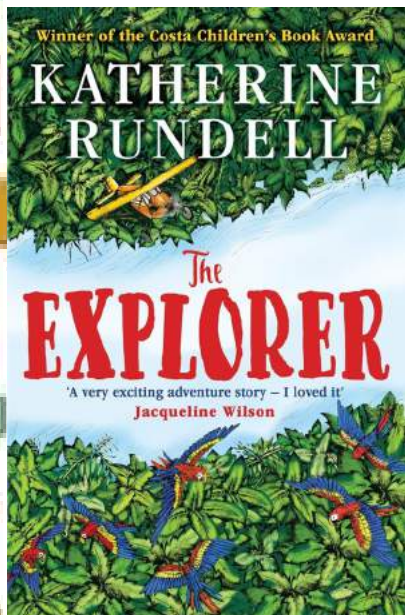
In Silver Studded Blues, they have read 'Where the World Turns Wild' by Nicola Penfold.
